

**Union Township Board of Supervisors
Minutes/ Regular Meeting
March 3, 2026**

The regular monthly meeting of the Union Township Board of Supervisors was held on March 3, 2026. Supervisors Allred, Reitz and Wright were present. Attendance sheet is attached.

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM followed by the pledge to the flag.

Having reviewed the minutes of the previous meeting a motion was made by Tom Reitz, seconded by Todd Wright and carried to approve the minutes as presented.

The Roadmaster gave a report and updated the board on equipment maintenance issues. The Chairman brought up issues with the generator and asked that the Roadmaster move forward with getting that resolved.

Christian Rosini and Rich Gardner with UGI attended the meeting. The Attorney for UGI presented Atty. Lyons with a new Agreement to review. The Chairman brought up the verbal agreements that were made last year with UGI and noted that moving forward everything will be in writing. Mr. Rosini denied verbally approving that in 2026 UGI would reimburse the township for one lane of chipping of Trutt and Felmey Road, where the new pipeline was installed. After reviewing the Agreement, a motion was made by Billy Allred, seconded by Tom Reitz and carried to accept the Road and Restoration Agreement with UGI as presented. The Board also discussed with Atty. Lyons that they would like him to start preparing a Road Opening Ordinance so that these issues can be avoided in the future.

An issue with the maintenance of Wilshirl Lane, a private road, was discussed with Attorney Lyons. Atty. Lyons reiterated that the township has no role in enforcing a subdivision plan that was approved by the Planning Commission, but only to make sure that the plan is originally recorded correctly.

A motion was made by Tom Reitz, seconded by Todd Wright and carried to send a letter to Tom Squires at Penn DOT requesting an increase in the speed limit zone on SR 304 in Dry Valley so that the speed limit can be enforced. PSP will be copied on the letter.

A request for compensation as EMC was made by Gary Brouse due to the amount of time spent on training and in his role as EMC. The Board recognized the tremendous job Mr. Brouse does. The Chairman recommended researching what the CKCOG is receiving from townships that do not have an EMC and discussing that amount with Brouse. This will be discussed at the next meeting.

Checks 6300 – 6321 were presented for payment with bills totaling 11,616.69. A motion to approve the bills as presented was made by Tom Reitz, seconded by Todd Wright and carried.

Motion to adjourn the meeting at 8:45 PM was made by Billy Allred, seconded by Todd Wright and carried.
