

**Union Township Board of Supervisors
Minutes/ Regular Meeting
July 7, 2026**

The regular monthly meeting of the Union Township Board of Supervisors was held on July 7, 2026. Supervisors Allred, Reitz and Wright were present.

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM followed by the pledge to the flag.

Having reviewed the minutes of the June meeting, a motion was made by Tom Reitz, seconded by Todd Wright and carried to approve the minutes as presented.

Public Comment: None

Roadmaster Report:

- Replacement of pipes on Supplee Mill that were cut by UGI pipeline installation was discussed. An estimate of 1000 per pipe was received in addition to the cost of stone and paving. EBT will help with installation. The project is tabled for the time being until it is determined if and where the pipes are needed.
- Mowing of Township roads was discussed. The Board expressed the importance that all roads be mowed in a timely manner.
- The Chairman asked the Roadmaster to start a log of where all of the pipes are located and keep track of when we pave and tar and chip so we have a record of what is next to be done.
- The Roadmaster, Zane and Jeff will be on vacation July 17 – 26.

The trash issue on Albert Blvd. was again discussed with Atty. Lyons. In response to his letter, the home owners mowed, however through the trash, leaving it behind. Atty. Lyons is going to send another letter and due to his absence at the August meeting, they will have until the September meeting to respond.

The Road Opening Ordinance was again discussed. The Board will review the proposed Ordinance again this month to be prepared to discuss revisions at the August meeting.

The Attorney for UGI has still not responded to Attorney Lyons' attempts to reach him regarding reimbursement for the chipping promised in 2025.

The No Parking signs placed on development roads are causing concern with residents. The Chairman asked the Roadmaster to make sure they are only in the cul-de-sacs, and to bring it to the attention of the Board before placing additional signs of any kind throughout the Township.

Larson Design Group performed an inspection on the Amish Road bridge. The Chairman reported on their findings. It was discussed that there is some scouring under the bridge caused by flooding that will need to be addressed either with concrete or stone reinforcement.

It was determined by having a new service person inspect the generator that the ignition issues are due to an insufficiently sized line and changing of the regulator by UGI at the new service installation. A new regulator will be installed at the generator and the meter by Eco Air.

Water run off concerns at 687 Trutt Road were brought to the attention of the Board and discussed with Atty. Lyons.

Checks 6398 – 6423 were presented for payment for a total of 39,766.27. Motion to approve bills as presented was made by Tom Reitz, seconded by Todd Wright and carried.

The Board discussed some concerns with the Roadmaster.

Motion to adjourn the meeting at 9:15 PM was made by Tom Reitz, seconded by Todd Wright and carried.
