## ORDINANCE NO. 93-3

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UNION, UNION COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING SECTIONS 2 AND 6 OF ORDINANCE NO. 75-1, ENACTED JANUARY 7, 1975, WHICH ESTABLISHED THE PROCEDURE FOR OPENING OR CUTTING PUBLIC STREETS OF THE TOWNSHP, BY CHANGING THE SCHEDULE OF FEES TO THE ONE ESTABLISHED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF TOWNSHIPS AND INCREASING THE MAXIMUM FINE FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF TO SIX HUNDRED (\$600.00) DOLLARS.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Union, Union County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

Section 1. The second sentence of Section 2 of Ordinance No. 75-1, enacted January 7, 1975, is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

"The application shall be accompanied by a fee in accordance with the Schedule of Fees established by the Pennsylvania State Association of Townships, for Highway Occupancy Permits and Restoration Charges."

Section 2. Section 6 of Ordinance No. 75-1, enacted January 7, 1975, is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

"Any person, firm, corporation or utility who shall violate any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a summary offense and, upon conviction thereof in a summary proceeding before a District Justice, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than Six Hundred (\$600.00) Dollars, plus costs of prosecution, and/or be imprisoned for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days. Each day that such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense."

Section 3. Except as amended by this Ordinance, all of the provisions of Ordinance No. 75-1, enacted January 7, 1975, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after enactment.
