

Union Township Board of Supervisors
Minutes/ Regular Meeting
July 6, 2021

The regular monthly meeting of the Union Township Board of Supervisors was held on July 6, 2021. Supervisors Reitz, Allred and Bieber were present. Also in attendance were Atty. Lyons, Jeffery Brouse, and Corey Mitchell.

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM followed by the pledge to the flag.

Minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed and a motion was made by Tom Reitz, seconded by Billy Allred and carried to approve the minutes as presented.

Public Comment: None

Pastor Corey Mitchell of the Winfield Baptist Church attended the meeting to request mulch from the Township for the use of creating a walking trail around the church property. The church is developing the 1 mile path for community use. The Board agreed that the church could have the mulch and to load it onto trucks provided by them.

Roadmaster Report:

- The William Street project is completed.
- Paving on Amish Road N & S is complete.
- To help emergency dispatch and utility companies eliminate confusion, it was requested by the Fire Company that the road name of Mulls Hollow North be changed to distinguish it with 911 from Mulls Hollow South. The Board agreed to have the Secretary look into changing the road name with Penn DOT as well as asking the one property owner who would have to change their address if they have a name preference. Changing Amish Road South was also discussed but it was decided that there are too many residents that would be impacted by an address change.

Discussion was held with Atty. Lyons on amending the budget for ARF that will be received this year as well as recycling grant money that will now be coming in but was not budgeted. When the ARF are ready to be used, the budget will have to be amended, however not for recycling grant revenue.

PSTAS Centennial Dinner will be held on October 14, 2021. At this time the Board does not plan on attending at the ticket price of \$100.00.

Supervisor Allred brought up Township mowing due to resident concerns. Because of a breakdown on the mower, the Roadmaster was behind schedule. Adding more hours for one of the equipment operators to get caught up was also discussed.

Checks 4846 – 4876 were presented for payment with bills totaling \$61,726.50. A motion was made by Mark Bieber, seconded by Tom Reitz and carried to approve bills as presented.

A motion was made by Billy Allred, seconded by Mark Bieber and carried to adjourn the meeting at 8:30 PM.
